

[A] Is it true I can get IDP credit for attending a lecture at the School of Architecture?

Note: If you don't have an NCARB number or haven't submitted an eligibility date form go back to the PDF **How can I get started with IDP?** and follow the directions.

Process: To receive IDP credit for attending a lecture you first need a temporary AIA number from the AIA. The simple process is outlined below:

1. The first thing you should do is access the NCARB website at: www.ncarb.org
2. Then click on the IDP quick link and download the IDP Guidelines.
3. Follow the guidelines:
 - a. (See page 20, SUPPLEMENTAL EXPERIENCE FOR ELECTIVE HOURS, AIA Continuing Education) To report AIA Continuing Education (attending lectures is a form of continuing education) you must first download and complete the webform: info.aia.org/aia/freeTranscriptsforInterns.cfm
 - b. Fill out the form and click the submit button. The AIA will email you with a temporary AIA number.
then
 - c. At every lecture you will see Sharon with a clipboard. If you place your name and temporary AIA number on that sheet you will receive continuing education credit which will translate into IDP credits and help you on your path towards licensure.
